Guidelines for Recording Your Max's AI Chronicles Video

Tips to help you shine in your 3–5 minute video

Whether you're recording yourself or joining us for a Zoom interview, here are a few simple tips to help your video look and sound great:

1. Keep It Short & Clear

- Aim for **3–5 minutes** total. We're looking for one or two key points, explained clearly.
- Speak naturally—as if you're talking to a curious friend or a student.

2. Choose a Quiet, Well-Lit Space

- Record in a **quiet environment** free from background noise or interruptions.
- Make sure your face is well-lit—natural light from a window or a lamp works great.
- Avoid sitting in front of windows or bright lights, which can create shadows.

3. Position Your Camera

- Use a laptop webcam, phone, or external camera.
- Keep your **camera at eye level** and make sure your head and shoulders are in the frame.
- If using a phone, please record in landscape (horizontal) mode.

4. Sound Quality Matters

- Use headphones or an external microphone if possible.
- Speak clearly and avoid covering your mouth or turning away from the mic.

5. Keep Backgrounds Simple

- Choose a **neutral or tidy background** that isn't distracting.
- Avoid virtual backgrounds unless they are professional and not glitchy.

6. What to Wear

- Dress casually but professionally—whatever you'd wear to a work video call.
- Avoid clothing with small patterns or busy prints (they can distort on camera).

7. Helpful Extras (Optional)

- If you mention your company, product, or project, we're happy to include a **logo** (send us a high-res version).
- If you'd like to show something (e.g., AI-generated art, graphs, screenshots), let us know—we can include visuals in the final edit.

8. Review Before Sending

• If you're self-recording, watch your video before submitting. Check for clear audio and no major distractions.

• When you're ready, send us the video using the method we discussed.
